SLP Grants for PTP



PTP Grants for SLP

- Established to assist SLP clubs in financing PTP service projects on a start up basis
- PTP grants are for new PTP projects only
- Grant funding is limited to 50% of the total project cost, up to \$250 per grant

Did not complete all of the application

Did not include Project Budget



How to Apply for a Grant

- Complete the appropriate PTP grant application
- Include the following:
 - An estimate of service hours committed to the project
 - Date when funds are required
 - A copy of the club's current year *Community Service Budget (if available)*
 - *A project budget* including club funds committed, "in-kind" donations, and any other sources of outside funding



Question #1

From October 9th-11th, 2009, UCSD Circle K will be serving Miller Elementary School's students, their families, and faculty through planting a garden, a health and conservation fair and mural painting project.

Question #2

UCSD Circle K will be serving the students, families, friends, and faculty of Miller Elementary School in San Diego, CA. On Friday, October 9, 2009, we will be working with an afterschool program to plant a fruit and/or vegetable garden on the Miller Elementary School campus for low-income families. This is a project that the students and their families can continue to maintain throughout the year. On Saturday, October 10, 2009, we will be holding a health and conservation fair which consists of informational booths, game booths, relay races, crafts, music, skills, and prizes. We estimate an attendance of 200 families. On Sunday, October 11, 2009, we will be designing and painting a mural emphasizing the importance of health and conservation. The purpose of this weekend project is to promote bettering the world through conservation and bettering yourself through living healthy lifestyles.

Question #3

The target audience of this project is the student body at Miller Elementary.

Question #9

Our project is closely related to the Objects of Kiwanis because we are promoting higher standards of health and conservation, educating the community to make intelligent choices, all while promoting Circle K, PTP, and Kiwanis. We are helping build and promote a healthy and positive environment where the children, and families of these children, will learn how to take care of their most important possessions; themselves. It is important that parents and guardians are educated on how to maintain a positive environment where their children and families can learn and grow. Through this project we are also hoping that the families and children will take leadership roles and educate the others in their lives about the lessons they learn throughout our project.

Question #10

About 65% of these students qualify for Free and Reduced lunches, meaning that they come from a low-income family, and almost half of the student population are English language learners. These students may not know or understand what all they can do to help protect and take care of themselves and the environments that they live in. Our project will teach them how to make eco-friendly choices as well as healthy/safe choices. Green choices will protect the environment while safe choices can protect children on bikes, other pedestrians, as well as drivers on the road. Healthy choices can prevent pediatric trauma.

Question #11

Each year, the Service Chair at UCSD plans a Large Scale Service Project (LSSP). The Health and Conservation Fair is the 2009 Fall LSSP. Next year, the Service Chair may choose to hold a similar project or a different project. However, UCSD Circle K has already teamed up with other Circle K clubs within the Paradise division to serve the Miller Elementary campus. We plan to continue to serve the students and families in this community.

3. Applicant must be a high school senior who plans to enroll full time in a college, university, or institution of higher education the next year.
