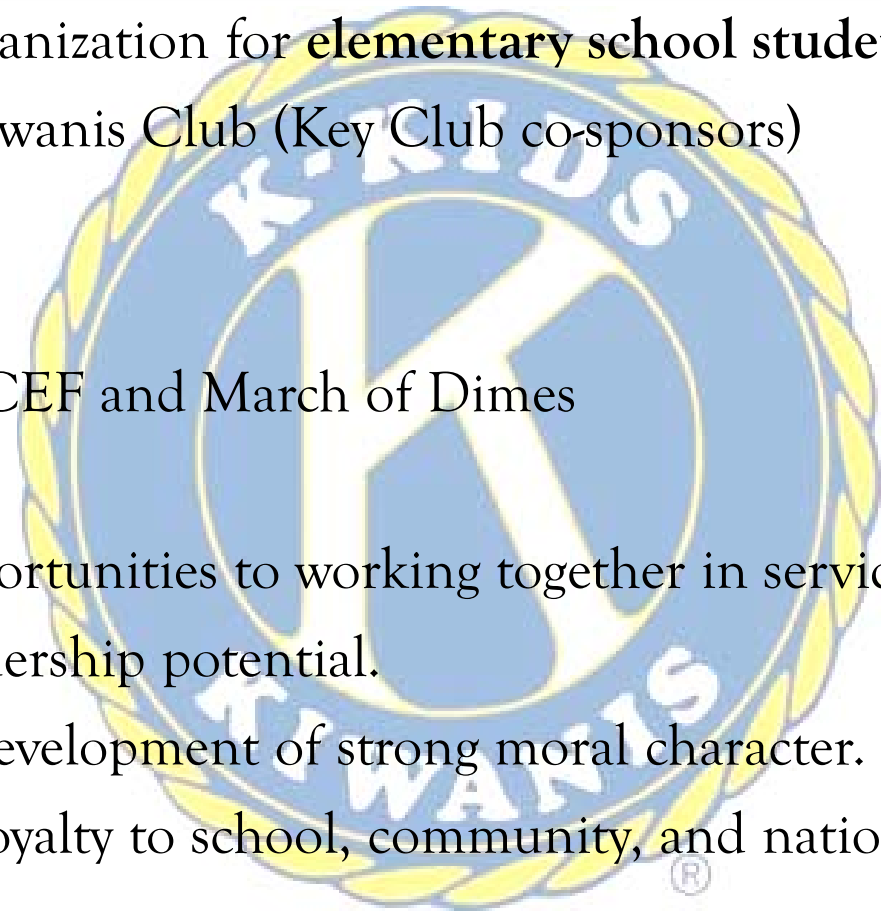

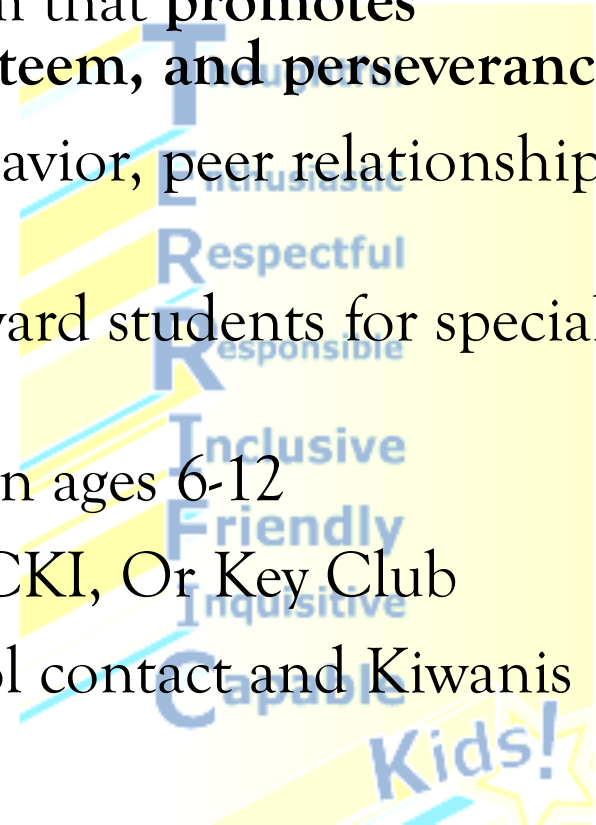
## K-KIDS

- Student Led service organization for **elementary school students**
- Sponsored by a local Kiwanis Club (Key Club co-sponsors)
- **Motto:** “*We Build.*”
- Annually club fees
- **Service Partners:** UNICEF and March of Dimes
- **Objectives:**
  - To provide opportunities to working together in service
  - To develop leadership potential.
  - To foster and development of strong moral character.
  - To encourage loyalty to school, community, and nation.



## TERRIFIC KIDS

- A student recognition program that **promotes character development, self esteem, and perseverance.**
- Students work to improve behavior, peer relationships, attendance, or schoolwork.
- Provides teachers a tool to reward students for special achievements.
- Elementary school age children ages 6-12
- Sponsored by Kiwanis Club, CKI, Or Key Club
- Required volunteers are school contact and Kiwanis Terrific Kids chairperson
- **Costs:** Annually



## BUG – BRINGING UP GRADES

- A program designed to recognize students who raise their grades to an acceptable range.
- Recognition includes schools BUG Honor Roll; a food-themed party and etc.
- A sponsoring club helps support the BUG Program in the school.
- This program can be adapted to work with any grading system.
- Elementary school age children ages 6-12
- Sponsored by Kiwanis Club, CKI, Or Key Club
- Required volunteers are school contact and Kiwanis BUG chairperson.
- Costs: Annually

## BUILDER'S CLUB

- The largest service organization for middle school students ages 12-14
- A “student-led” community service organization that operates under school regulations.
- **Motto:** “*Building leaders.*”
- **Vision:** To develop competent, capable, caring leaders through service.
- **Mission:** To provide members with opportunities to perform service, build character, and develop leadership.
- Required volunteers are faculty advisors and Kiwanis advisors
- **Annually:** club fee

## KEY LEADER

- Kiwanis International's **leadership education program** for students. Its mission is to provide a “life-changing experience that inspires young people to achieve their personal best through service leadership.
- A line-up of workshops, lectures and team building activities takes place over the course of the weekend (3 days)
- High school students ages 14-18.
- 60 attendees per weekend/ 10 required volunteers per weekend
- **Key Leader builds:**
  - Personal Integrity, Personal growth, Respect, Building Community, Pursuit of Excellence.







## KIWIN'S

- 32nd District of Key Club International (KCI).
- Located in California, Nevada, and Hawaii.
- Performs service deeds to improve schools and communities.
- Over 50 clubs with approximately 2,500 members and still growing.
- KIWIN'S divisions are coral, crystal, diamond, emerald, goldstone, jade, jet, ruby, sapphire, topaz, and turquoise.
- The District Board consists of 12 Lt. Governors.

## CIRCLE K

- 450 colleges in 17 nations.
- Circle K International (CKI) is the premiere university service organization in the world sponsored by Kiwanis International.
- College and university students ONLY
- **Required volunteers:** Faculty advisor and Kiwanis Advisor
- **Costs:** annually: Individual membership dues
- **Service Partners:** UNICEF, March of Dimes,
  - Better World Books, Students Team Up to Fight Hunger

## AKTION CLUB

- 
 George D. “Jake” Swartout, 1988-89 Governor of the Florida District, organized the first Aktion Club, for **adults who live with a disability**, in Putnam County, Florida in 1987.
- 
**Mission:** develop initiative and leadership skills; serve their community; integrate into society, dignity and value of citizens living with disabilities.
- 
**Objects:** Primacy to the human and spiritual; encourage living of the Golden Rule; promote higher business, professional, and social standards; build better communities; and create and maintain public opinion and high idealism.
- 
 Required volunteers: Facility advisor and Kiwanis advisor
- 
 Membership fees paid annually
- 
**Service Partner:** Sleeping Children Around the World (SCAW)

## KIWANIS INTERNATIONAL

- Organization of service clubs headquartered in Indianapolis, Indiana, and made up of approximately 8,600 clubs in 96 countries with over 586,000 adult members.
- A global organization of members of every age who are dedicated to changing the world, one child and one community at a time.
- Kiwanis and UNICEF join forces to implement the ELIMINATE project.
- The Eliminate project will deliver vaccines to protect mothers and babies from tetanus.
- Over the next 5 years, Kiwanis International will raise \$110 million.

## KIWANIS ONE DAY

- The Kiwanis Service Initiative is observed worldwide in April - Kiwanis One Day.
- Every club is encouraged to join with every level of the Kiwanis Family for a day of united service.
- Kiwanis One Day provides an opportunity to showcase the Kiwanis family and our commitment to service in each community.
- Every club follows a plan, which includes tips on forming a committee, selecting a project, motivation and incentives, and a template news release to inform the news media.

## CO-SPONSORSHIP

*Would you like to co-sponsor?*

-  Key Club has the ability to co-sponsor only K-Kids, Builder's Club, or Aktion Club.
-  Terrific Kids or Bring Up Grades can be co-sponsored once a K-Kids is chartered.

## STEP ONE: FIND

- The first step in building the club is to lay the foundation:
  - Finding a place to meet
    - *A school, community center or other facility*
  - A supporting sponsor
    - *A Kiwanis Club sponsors an SLP club – offering both financial support and hands-on guidance*
  - Hands-on advisors
    - *You'll need an advisor from the site and your local Kiwanis Club\**
  - Core group of members to get the club off the ground.

## STEP ONE: FIND

Five steps for Kiwanis clubs that sponsor:

1. **Meet your partners.** Invite the school or site administrators of the club you plan to charter to attend a Kiwanis club meeting.
2. **Find core volunteers.** Have the school or site administrator or principals recommend a core group of volunteers from the potential club site. They will help you in developing a plan for chartership.
3. **Seek district support.** Your regional advisors have resources, connections, and experience to guide your efforts.
4. **Meet leaders.** Meet the school's or site's potential advisor(s) to clarify roles and how the institution will benefit from having the SLP.

## STEP ONE: FIND

- 📌 Resources: *Gather tools you'll need to build, grow and lead your club.*
  - 📌 **The basics:** Determine club structure and organization.
  - 📌 **PR tools:** Learn responsibilities and order free posters, brochures, and video.
  - 📌 **Advisor tips:** Know what to ask – and expect from – advisors.

## STEP TWO: LEAD



### Organize:

- Meet new members to adopt club bylaws.
- Help elect officers and directors
- Help plan your club's meeting schedule
- Help in brainstorming service ideas.



### Charter:

- Gather signatures
- Create a roster
- Complete forms

## STEP TWO: LEAD

- **Train:** Make sure to help in training officers, budgeting, and setting goals.
  - **Learn** officer and committee roles and duties.
  - **Find** sample agendas and icebreaker ideas
  - **Access** tools for every step

## STEP THREE: SERVE

*Once the club is official, it's time to reach out to the community and make a difference through meaningful service projects. Guide them through club members' passions and talk to them about the significance of community service.*

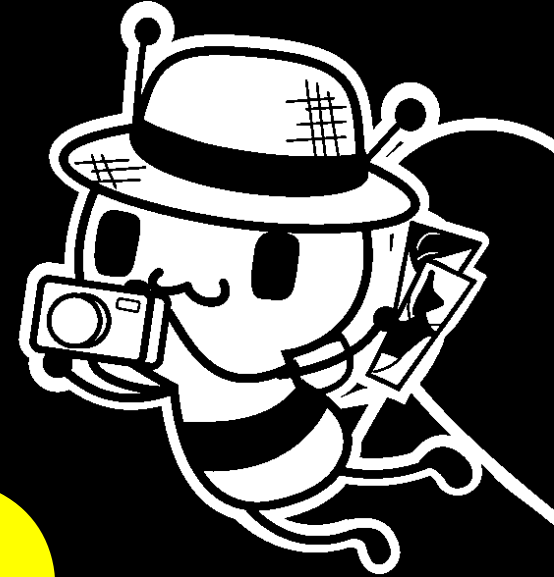
