Date: Wednesday, August 12th, 2009

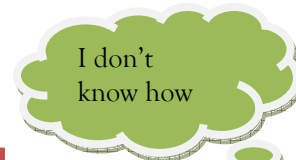
Time: 4:00 - 6:00 PM

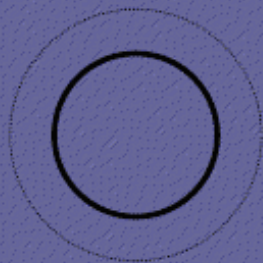

Do NOT use thick paper/card stock because the thin plastic cover will not wrap around the button correctly.

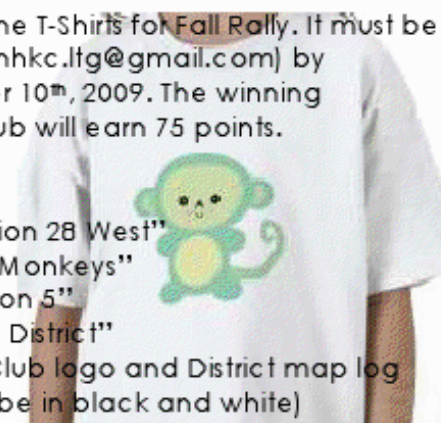
