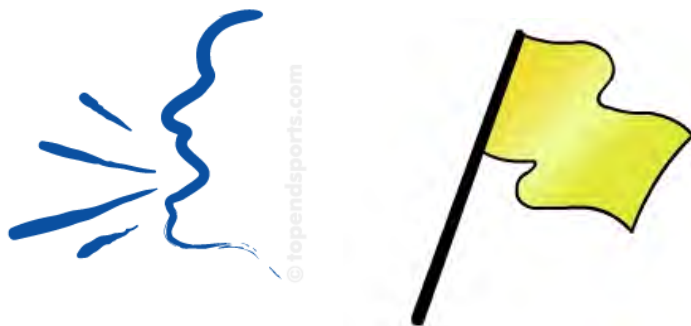

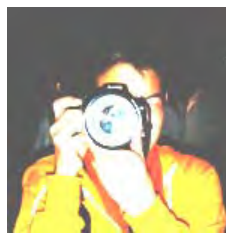
THE ROARING MONSTER

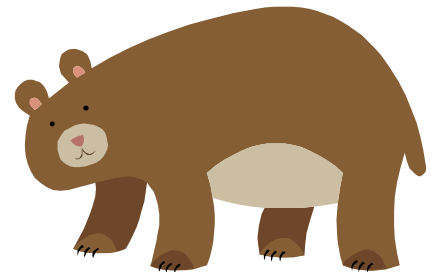

Helpful Hints

[+] PUBLICITY

Publicizing is KEY to having successful events. When publicizing events, make sure to have a set date, time, and location. At meetings, use meeting agendas and fliers. Outside of meetings, use phone calls, e-mails, and websites.

[+] COMMUNICATION

If there is a lack of communication between your officer team and your club, you're more likely to have less participation and more confusion. Communication is truly important for everyone to bond with one another and publicize about certain information. Make sure that your publicity chair/bulletin editor/web technician continues with updates. Officers, try sending out personal emails and phone calls.

[+] CLUB BUILDING & UNIFICATION

If you feel your club's spirit is decreasing, then put this initiative at the top of your to-do list of the year. We don't want to see clubs fall in the future, so improvement should be accomplished now! Start by building your club by recruiting members to join. Use good communication and publicity tactics. With your new members, don't forget to make a great first impression. Be professional, yet outgoing. Personally tell them about your favorite events and explain how fun they are. Give them something to come back for more. Once they are in, try unifying your club through bonding at service events and socials! Officers, talk to your members, don't leave them hanging around all alone. Make friends along the way!

[+] LOST & CONFUSED OVER YOUR DUTIES

Every club is managed differently and each position is different at every school. The best way to resolve this is to hold a board meeting and discuss what your officer team expects you to do during your term. Ask your president as well since he/she can delegate tasks for you to complete. A lot of you have questions about your duties and the best way to get answers is by talking to me personally. Shoot me an email or call me up, and I can help you by providing tips and resources on what you should be doing.

[+] MAKING THINGS FUN & MEMBER MOTIVATION

Motivating members is one of the most difficult things. Sometimes it's hard to keep them paying attention to you, but try this simple tip: Make yourself sound outgoing and funny at the same time. Combine these two and express yourself, but not too much, you don't want to scare people away. This will get the members to feel like what you are saying is fun, so they might try it out as well.

[+] LEAD BY EXAMPLE

As an officer, you are a leader whether you like it or not. Members look up to you and they want to see a responsible leader run their club properly. Freshman will judge your actions immediately at first sight. Stay cool and lead your club!

[+] LTG VISITATIONS

Since school is starting, it will be very difficult for me to visit all of you between classes. But please don't let that stop you from inviting me to your club functions. If your club is having any events that are during non-school hours or over the weekends, then I would love to come! Just email me the date, time, and locations and I will try to visit you as much as I can! My goal is to visit each club as many times as I can!

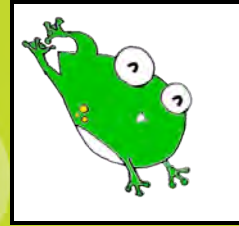
