This fall, the Hawaii Partnership to Prevent Underage Drinking (HPPUD) is launching a statewide campaign, targeting young adults and parents to educate & raise awareness of underage drinking. HPPUD is enlisting the help of Key Clubs from across the state to take the lead at their respective schools by creating an on-campus service project to drive young adults to the website. HPPUD is hoping to send out a starter packet with more information in September to all of the Key Clubs.
