EVENT IDEAS

workshops and seminars

Collaborate with other clubs such as American Red Cross, local shelters and senior homes, the Boys and Girls Club, and HOSA (Future Health Professionals). Educate members about Covid-19 and precautions that people that they should take to promote their health and safety during this time. These workshops can be hosted through Zoom or any other video conferencing platform.

support preferred charities

Educate members on our preferred charities through educational presentations. Host fundraisers to raise money for the Pediatric Trauma Program, Eliminate, March of Dimes, Children's Miracle Network, and UNICEF; all of these charities share the same goal of improving the health of those in need. Fundraisers can be done online through donations.

SERVICE PROJECT IDEAS

six feet apart supplies project

Organize a program where volunteers can deliver groceries to people who are at high-risk for Covid-19. People can pay volunteers the money necessary to get their groceries, then the volunteer can leave the bag of groceries outside the particular house. This protects the health of those who are at risk.

face masks

Create face masks to protect people from catching the virus. Face masks are necessary for people who are going into public places. Although hospitals do not accept homemade masks, JoAnn's and local senior homes usually accept masks. Face masks can be sewn using cloth or put together with a cloth bandana.

charity miles

Download the app, Charity Miles, and earn money for your charity of choice by running/walking. Promote a healthy lifestyle by exercising while simultaneously earning money for charity (some of these include March of Dimes, The World Food Programme, and Save the Children).

FUNDRAISER IDEAS

make and sell

Make goods, care bears, bracelets, and other items to sell to spread awareness and raise funds to donate. Host a service project to make PTP dolls or first-aid kits to donate directly. Partner with other organizations or clubs within your division as well!

donations

Since it is currently impossible to host bake sales or sell food at Division Council Meetings, the only way to raise money for our preferred charities is through donation drives. Many Lt. Governors incentivize their division, stating that if they raise a certain amount of money, they will do something in return. This could include learning a dance, cutting/dying their hair, or posting something embarrassing.
