Governor: Yellow To help you identify the office that each candidate is running for, the colors on the left have been assigned to each position. Be on the lookout for these specific colors during Candidate Meet and Greet and Caucus Session!

International Endorsement: Blue

Candidate Meet and Greet

Friday, April 1st | 2:30 PM - 5:15 PM | Grand Salon

As a delegate, it is highly recommended to attend Candidate Meet and Greet. Candidate Meet and Greet is an important part of the election process. Here, you will be able to personally talk to each of the candidates running for the Executive positions and International Endorsement. Use this time to learn more about their platforms, ask questions, and get to know each of the candidates before casting your ballot during House of Delegates. Remember, an educated delegate is an effective delegate, so use this opportunity to your advantage!

Delegate Registration

Please note that if your club has not registered one to two delegates online, you are still eligible to register on-side at the Delegate Registration Booth located in the **Grand Salon**.

On the Friday of Convention Registration, there is a separate registration booth for delegates. It is organized by the name of the club. Delegates must be present at registration to receive their delegate wristband and printed booklet.

If chosen, please do your best to represent the views of your club, and most importantly, your members, when considering candidate selections and bylaw resolutions.

Election Process | Caucus Session Procedure



What is Caucus? Caucus is a session in which each District and International candidate is given a set amount of time to give a brief speech that details their goals and qualifications. It is followed a round of questions from delegates that candidates answer.

Caucus and Moderators: Caucus will be held in Reno Ballroom. It is advised that you arrive early as the session will promptly begin at 8:00 AM. The Policy, International Business, & Elections Chair will serve as the caucus moderator while the District Governor will serve as the assistant caucus moderator. The PIE

Committee Mentor will serve as the adult moderator to help the PIE Chair keep order. These moderators will time the candidates and deem which questions are appropriate or not, based upon whether the question is in bad taste or of a harassing nature.

Candidates: All candidates running for District office or International Endorsement will appear in the Caucus Session and the timer will begin when their appointed time is scheduled.

Etiquette: The candidates are not to be touched, asked to ingest any material or asked to partake in any behavior that is in poor taste. No objects may be thrown or propelled by any means in the Caucus rooms. Rude behavior will not be tolerated. Persons are not allowed to enter or leave the room while candidates are present.

Election Process | House of Delegates

Procedure: Each club is allowed up to two delegates, who must be registered prior to the House of Delegates. The House of Delegates members will listen to the candidates' final statements and answers to questions from each of the current Executives and vote by ballot for the candidate of their choice.

Purpose: The House of Delegates provides a forum for the candidates for each office to present their final message to the District delegates, and where delegates vote for each position. This is where the delegates will give their final vote!

After the Governor convenes the House, delegate entry and exit will only be allowed during periods between candidate presentations.

Candidates: If there are more than two candidates for an office or more than four seeking endorsement, then a Nominating Conference will be conducted. After the Nominating Conference, two (2) final Executive candidates and up to three (3) endorsement candidates will appear on the final ballot.

No cell phone or any other electronic device usage is permitted during House of Delegates.

Nomination Conference: If this is necessary, the candidates will be introduced to the conference and voted on in the following order: Governor, Secretary, Treasurer, and International Endorsement. There will be no speeches or questions. Results will be announced prior to the closing of this session.

International Endorsement: International rules state that "a district shall endorse not more than one candidate for the office of President or Vice-President, and two candidates for the office of Trustee." If there is only one candidate for endorsement, delegates are to choose whether to vote "yes" to endorsing the candidates or voting "no" to not endorsing the candidates.

Spectators: A spectator section, separate from the delegate seating area, for non-delegate members and adult chaperones will be provided. Spectators may not sit with or talk to the delegates, nor take part in the process. Silence must be observed at all times. Entry and exit of spectators will only be allowed during periods between candidate presentations.

Election Results: The results of the ballot voting will be announced during the Saturday evening at Third General Session.

Election Process | Caucus Questions

Any time left over after the candidate has finished their speech is open for questions. **Adults** are not allowed to ask questions or suggest any to the members.

Look below for some sample questions and DO's and DON'Ts:

ACCEPTABLE QUESTIONS ARE questions regarding the candidate's qualifications, platform, past experience, and elaborations on plans and goals.

Examples of GOOD Acceptable Questions:

- How would you balance this position with school and other extracurricular activities?
- Are you good with deadlines?
- How will you strengthen Kiwanis relations?
- What is your strongest quality and how will you use it to the best of your ability through your best position?
- Out of all the core values, which one is your favorite and how will you apply it?
- Out of all your goals, which one is one you really want to emphasize on?
- What past experience have you had that helped you prepare to run for this position?
- How will you voice the member's opinions and ideas?
- What is your weakest quality and how will you work at improving it through this position?
- Explain how to improve communications between the many levels of Key Club International?

UNACCEPTABLE QUESTIONS ARE anything related to sex, religion, race, or politics.

Examples of BAD Unacceptable Questions:

"How do you feel?"

Election Process | Caucus Questions (Continued)

Tip: When asking questions, remember that your goal is to make an informed decision regarding their candidacy, not make inappropriate comments!

PERSONAL QUESTIONS

- 1. Why did you decide to run for this position?
- 2. How has Key Club shaped the way you view community service?
- 3. Who was your biggest influence?
- 4. What does service mean to you?
- 5. How can social media positively or negatively influence our district?
- 6. What is your stand on abiding by Graphic Standards? (hint: look at their literature to check if they followed standards)
- 7. What are your best and worst qualities?
- 8. Why did you first join Key Club?

GOVERNOR QUESTIONS

- 1. What will you do to provide help to club officers, specifically Presidents and Vice Presidents?
- 2. What qualities do you think make a good Governor and how can you develop these?
- 3. What are some ways you can promote an increase membership?
- 4. How will you represent CNH's interest in Key Club International Business?
- 5. In what new ways will you utilize committee chairs to further progress achieving District?

SECRETARY QUESTIONS

- Explain the most important traits of being a successful District Secretary and how you reflect?
- 2. Explain the importance of the Monthly Report Forms and turning them in on time.
- 3. What kind of support will you provide club secretaries?

TREASURER QUESTIONS

- Dues can sometimes be viewed as expensive, how will you address this issue?
- 2. What benefits are received by members from District and International dues?
- 3. How will you encourage clubs to pay dues on time?
- 4. How do you plan for clubs to reactivate their charters?

MISCELLANEOUS QUESTIONS

- 1. What is one major goal you wish to accomplish through the position you are running for?
- 2. Name all of the District Committees
- 3. Who is our current Kiwanis District Governor?
- 4. Who is the International Trustee assigned to our district?
- 5. How many divisions are in CNH?
- 6. Name the four Key Club International preferred charities.
- 7. How did Key Club get its name?

Election Process | Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

1. If my home club did not register delegates online prior to District Convention, can I still register as a delegate and vote at House of Delegates?

Yes, members are still able to register at the designated "Delegate Registration Booth" on-site during District Convention, prior to the start of Caucus Session and House of Delegates.

- 2. Are there any pre-election functions that the members should be attending? Members are encouraged to attend Candidates' Meet and Greet on Friday, April 1st.
- 3. **Before caucus begins, are rules/procedures/ other information shared with the attendees?** The Policy, International, and Elections Committee hosts the election and releases guidelines for caucus questions in the Candidates' Booklet. The PIE Chair, District Governor, and Adult PIE Mentor moderate Caucus.
- 4. **Is there an introduction of candidates or list read off before the elections of the candidates?** Candidates create their own literature (1 page) to be compiled in the annually-released Candidates' Booklet. Candidates are announced as they enter each speech/ caucus room.
- 5. **When will the results be announced?** General Session 3.
- 6. When do the elected officials begin their term? Immediately following Installation Sunday morning.

Governor Annual Responsibilities:

- Preside at all District Board Training Conferences & Meetings. Aide in the planning of the meeting and prepare an agenda which should be sent out to the board 1-2 weeks before the meeting. Provide a Governor's Report at all board meetings.
- Preside at all Leadership Team meetings and conference calls.
- Complete monthly reports and evaluations for District and International.
- Contribute to the District Newsletter monthly.
- Publish (at least) 10 Board newsletters, 4-6 Club Presidents' newsletters, and 4-6 Club Vice Presidents' newsletters. Newsletter information should contain relevant information to aid them in their positions. Include topics from KCI Distinguished Governor Guidelines.
- Publish two Club Presidents and Club Vice Presidents training manuals, one in the summer and one in the spring.
- Maintain and update a CNH Presidents' and Vice Presidents' email reflector on a regular basis. Update the officers on important deadlines, District and International news, and advice.
- Communicate with the District Administrator at least once a week. The preferred method of communication will be determined by mutual agreement.
- Maintain regular contact with your fellow Executives and encourage them to send out reminders to Lt. Governors on a regular basis.
- Maintain regular contact with the District Secretary, & Treasurer via Bee Team reflector and other preferable methods of communication.
- Maintain formal, monthly communication with the International Trustee, President, and Vice President, and the CNH Board
- Attend monthly conference calls for the BEE Team, Leadership Team, and committees.
- Ride the Kiwanis Float in the Rose Float Parade
- Promote International and District programs & initiatives.
- Provide support for all board members
- Promote and abide by the District Code of Conduct. Lead by example.
- Promote and abide by policies and guidelines regarding technology use

Governor Annual Responsibilities (Continued):

- Plan and attend Fall Rally Sessions.
- Address any disciplinary issues in a timely manner.
- Evaluate performance of all persons on the Board and be prepared to replace those not meeting acceptable standards. Attempt various interventions with Board members not performing and adhere to due process.
- Removal of persons must be in conformance with District policy. Only the Governor is authorize with the Administrators' approval, to remove persons from office. Due process including a warning letter should be followed prior to removal.
- Perform at least 50 hours of service to the home, school, and community and be a member in good standing in your home club.
- Assign caucus moderators, assign speaking assignments, assist with planning schedule of events, writing scripts, and completion of many convention details
- Judge ODE, MIDA, and Distinguished Lt. Governor
- Convention planning to be completed.
- Apply for Distinguished.

Why are you running for this particular office and how can you strengthen and influence the CNH District?

When I first joined my home club, we were a club with a relatively small membership. And when the covid-19 pandemic hit, soon after I had attended only a couple of meetings, the club had to hold its elections online through zoom. Although I had not known much about key club, when I heard that there was an opportunity to run as a club president, I volunteered without hesitation. Looking back, it was a quite impulsive decision because it was obvious that I lacked a basic understanding of key club and if elected, I would have to adapt to this virtual environment which I had no prior experience with. Because there was no other candidate, I was soon put into this position where, depending on my actions, could lead to the club's downfall or continual through this unprecedented time. I learned, one thing at a time, mrfs, club meetings, kiwanis, team planning. For the first few months, it was truly a time of trial and error. I held two zoom meetings every single week, one with my club and one with my leadership team. I composed my first meeting agenda, my first club meeting presentation, my first email, my first google form. Then I worked with my leadership team to locate and revive our social media so that we could gain members. On some Tuesdays, it would be my leadership team, my Kiwanis advisor, and one member and sometimes, there would be a bit more. Although sometimes, this made me feel powerless and exhausted, I kept persevering, and upheld my club until the end of the term maintaining 100% of the membership of the last n-person term. Then I decided to run for Lieutenant Governor for my division. This was another trial and error experience. When I entered the term,

I believed that the limitations of the pandemic would all lift and I could finally be able to host in-person dcms and meet all my members. This was cut short, however, and disregarding the limitations of covid-19, many other challenges rose, primarily with my geographically separated division. With much time left from planning simple, zoom meetings, I took the opportunity to experiment new implementations into our division. I followed the steps of the district, transforming monthly submission methods into google forms and making educational resources for my clubs. I also experimented with various division offices & committees, something that our division hasn't seen. We successfully set up a marketing committee which greatly improved our ability to make quality graphics, as well as extend division-involvement opportunities to members. To improve other connections with the Kiwanis and district programs, division coordinators were appointed for those specific roles. I believe that my will to take risks and try new things, my endless determination, and my understanding of the unique difficulties of a small club from a rural area is what makes me stand out as a candidate because I know what it takes to make change and I know what clubs, like the one I served, needs in order to succeed.

What was the most meaningful experience of service that you have experienced in Key Club? What made it so?

My most meaningful contribution of service while in CNH Key Club was definitely Relay For Life. This annual event dedicated to cancer patients held during the summer is something that our home club has been participating in for many years. And in 2020, I had the great opportunity to lead my key club as the team captain. Our key club was asked to create trinkets, or small gifts that would be given to patients. Meeting with my leadership team, we planned two virtual meetings called Trinkets are Treasures. On one day, our club folded origami butterflies and on the second day, we made our own unique trinkets, whether it be small empowering letters or custom stickers. I personally remember staying up until 2 am, the day before the event, putting together bracelets while others did the same. At the event, I collected everyone's creations and handed them over to the staff. For the meantime, myself and a couple of my club officers created flyers, tied purple ribbon around trees, and set up luminarias. Just before the event, I was pulled to the side by my kiwanis advisor and talked with one of the staff. She told me that the patients appreciated the trinkets so much, and she is thankful for us for putting them together. As much of a sentimental event this was for everyone there, at the end of the day, I felt the unique feeling of belonging and purpose, a feeling that key club volunteers know and cherish. This event gave me the motivation to keep wanting to stay in key club and furthermore, gave me the same passion that makes me want to serve you all as your next district treasurer because if it weren't for this organization. I wouldn't have these unforgettable memories. I want our CNH District to overcome our challenges, such as our membership crisis, so that we can continue upholding our key clubs that offer high-school students unforgettable, one-of-a-kind experiences.

Why are you running for this particular office and how can you strengthen and influence the CNH District?

Of the three executive positions, I believe District Treasurer is the most underrated. They are the leading student figurehead behind the dues payment process and a primary correspondent to funds donated to our preferred charities. The treasurer position originally enticed me when I served as my home club's treasurer. Unbeknownst to me at the time, my term as treasurer would be unprecedented as we could no longer collect dues from members in-person. I felt stumped. How could we convince our members to go out of their ways to pay dues for an organization that took place entirely online. After educating our members and working closely with both my school's finance office and the membership services help-line to coordinate a viable solution for our dues payment process, we remarkably paid dues for 27 members- nearly the highest in D36E. My thorough

understanding of the Membership Update Center was especially vital during my term as Lieutenant Governor when 5/7 schools had treasurers who were unaware of the meticulousness required for their role. From 20-long email threads between myself and KCI to change a faculty advisor, to hours on FaceTime walking my treasurers through the process, I felt ecstatic knowing that this insight was truly helpful. Ultimately, we were able to pay dues for 6/7 clubs, with the seventh of the way. I'm confident that my clubs were not alone in this struggle. Serving on the Strategic Planning Committee, we were able to gather data from club treasurers who expressed this discontentment with the dues payment process. For my extensive experience working collaboratively with both club treasurers, faculty advisors, and KCI to ease the difficulties of the dues payment process as much as possible, I would stand out as a candidate for District Treasurer.

What was the most meaningful experience of service that you have experienced in Key Club? What made it so?

At this point, I'm entirely sure that I have the Key Club Pledge ingrained in my soul: "I pledge on my honor to uphold the objects of Key Club International, to build my home, school, and community, to serve my nation and the world, and to combat all forces which tend to undermine these institutions." Originally, I didn't fully understand what this meant, believing service only encompassed the hours spent distributing food or clean-up after a Football game. It wasn't until I worked alongside my home club's board did I understand just how extensive "service" could be. After our 3rd time making cards on Zoom, it was extremely evident that both our members and officers were growing increasingly despondent of these repetitive events. In an effort to add some variety, I reached out to our local children's libraries, asking if they accepted home-made bookmarks. Happily cooperating, we organized our most successful service event: Booking Smiles at the Smiley Library. Although this was a more memorable opportunity for hours, my most meaningful contribution of service was not helping to organize the event, but moreover, re-instilling excitement and enthusiasm for service within our members.

Bylaw Amendments

The California–Nevada–Hawaii District Board presents the following Bylaw Amendments to be voted on during House of Delegates at the 76th District Convention.

Edit - Article XI: REVENUE

Section I. Each member club will pay to the district for each and every member based upon the below district dues schedule:

Prior to October 1, 2022 the district dues will be \$4.50 per annum

From October 1, 2022 to September 30, 2023 the district dues will be \$5.00 per annum

From October 1, 2023 to September 30, 2024 the district dues will be \$5.50 per annum

From October 1, 2024 and going forward the district dues will be \$6.00 per annum

These dues will accrue on October I and will be remitted to the CNH Key Club District Office by the individual club not later than December I of each year.

Justification: The CNH District Board proposes this dues increase due to the deteriorating financial situation of the CNH Key Club District, which could possibly lead to insolvency. A couple of significant factors for this deterioration has been the ongoing decline in membership as well as the rising cost of inflation.
