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MENTOR DAY

Spend a day as a tutor/mentor for elementary or middle school students. Help them out with their homework or projects. In addition, you can hold fun activities for them. You could even hold a presentation for their parents to give them resources for helping their child transition to high school.

INCLUSION MONTH

Supplies

- ★ Box
- ★ Construction paper
- (Individualize for your own designs) : popsicle sticks to make furniture, ribbons/fabric, etc

A good way to benefit the children in your community is by hosting a book drive. Have your fellow Key Clubbers donate items and set up boxes around your school's campus to receive donations. You could even create a little incentive to get even more donations. For example, you could say that the top 3 donors would receive goodie bags.

A fulfilling and easy way to serve those around your age is by becoming an online tutor through SchoolHouse. It is a good program that is well-respected. Volunteering with them is a great way to serve your fellow high schoolers while strengthening your knowledge.



SELF CARE PACKS

Not only does this amazing toy bring joy to the kids of your community, but it can be fun for your members as well. Hold a race once all the boats are finished for some competitive fun. This service project is a fun way to meet others and create some fun for kids in your community.

Materials:

- ★ 3 wine corks
- ★ Toothpick
- ★ Rubber bands
- ★ Cotton String
- ★ Card stock paper or thin cardboard

Directions:

Wrap 3 wine corks with two rubber bands.

If you plan to race your toy boat in a creek or lake, attach a length of cotton string to keep your boat from floating away. Insert a toothpick into the middle cork (between the two rubber bands) to form the mast.

Add a cardstock sail by threading it through the toothpick, as shown.




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




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
