Pay What You Can Pop Up Food Stand!

Pay what you can restaurants work by offering multiple different payment options for the same meal:

Minimum = Pay what it takes (cost of ingredients)

Middle Ground = Pay what it costs to make

Max = Pay it forward; this price would average around what the meal would cost in most restaurants and helps support the stand. Can't Pay? The cost of the meal can be offset by volunteering for a set period of time. These pop-up locations can also be spots to collect donations for a drive.
