TRICK-OR-TREAT for UNICEF

Since 1950, Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF has raised \$177 million! Key Club International is partnered with UNICEF, raising funds for The Eliminate Project. Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF works in 190 countries around the world helping save and improve children's lives. A yearly campaign runs from early July to late June the following year. The busiest time of the year is October during Halloween as students go around with small cardboard boxes asking for coins as donations. These boxes can be ordered as early as late August as orders will start shipping before September 12th. The latest a club will be able to order is October 24th, so plan accordingly! When all coins are collected, do not send UNICEF any cash! Instead, make an equivalent donation to UNICEF using a credit card or writing a check. All donations are tax deductible and you will receive a receipt in the mail.

HOST A HUMANITARIAN AID WORKSHOP

Educate members/clubs on humanitarian aid foundations they can support and advocate for through volunteer work and fundraisers. You can also take this time to ask your Key Club community what humanitarian aid services (food banks, shelters, clinics, etc.) they want to do group volunteering with as well as open them up to more individual volunteering opportunities. Make the workshop interactive by making it a mini classroom "fair" and asking members and officers to run different booths..



SUPPLY DRIVE

Host supply drives and packaging events to create hygiene and winter survival kits for local shelters. Be sure to reach out to the shelters you want to partner with before hand to ask what they need the most!

VOLUNTEERING

Volunteer at local food banks sorting, packaging, and distributing foods. Many food banks would love to organize club or division wide food distribution sites or packaging events to provide hunger relief to people in need.





MAKE A TRICK-OR-TREAT BAG

Make Halloween special for all children, by donating a Hallows Eve Treat they will remember. (Donate to pediatric patients or foster kids, etc) Including

- ★ Coloring books and activities

FUNDRAISER IDEAS

HAVE FUN-A-THON

- ★ Dance-a-Thon: Ask a local supermarket to donate refreshments. Have a contest and award prizes to the most enthusiastic dancers, the best dressed, etc. See who can dance the longest! Consider charging entry or spectator fees, or have dancers collect "sponsors" to donate and root them on.
- ★ Read-a-Thon: For every book a child reads, have parents, friends, and neighbors make a donation to Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF. Donate per chapter for older kids or longer books.
- ★ Jump-a-Thon: (this is a wonderful activity for little kids.) Ask Family,friend, and neighbors to donate money for every minute that a child hops or jumps, or donate a coin per jump. See how long you can go!
- ★ Talent Show: Invite your school's musicians, performers, dancers, singers, actors, etc. to show off their skills! Consider charging an entry fee for participants and/or an admission fee for guests. If you make it a contest, consider letting spectators "vote" for their favorite performance by donating to each performer's Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF box. The one who raises the most wins!
- ★ Multicultural Festival: Have different students demonstrate the dancing, food, music, artwork, etc. of different countries in your school gymnasium or assembly room. Make it a pot-luck to experience diverse foods! Charge admission fees, or set up a station where participants can donate to UNICEF.


SOSP INFORMATION
