

# EVENT IDEAS

#### **BLANK SLATE DOLLS**

A classic project for the Pediatric Trauma Program is to make Blank Slate Dolls. These are plush dolls that pediatric patients could draw on and individuals to represent new beginnings and to help them heal from past traumas they have experienced. For these dolls you will need:

- ★ Fabric
- ★ Stuffing
- ★ Sewing needles and thread
- ★ And of course, busy bees!
- ★ Follow along this video

To get the supplies, ask clubs to collect supplies by holding a drive. We know this will be a laborious project, but everyone's hard work will bee worth it!

#### **EMERGENCY SUPPLIES KIT**

There are many ways you could benefit the children in your community. One way to do this is to create emergency kits for your community. These emergency kits will help aid in minimizing the number of injuries children suffer from traumatic events each day. Get donations from your school, division, and community. Have members create guides for families on how to make a plan on what to do in case of emergencies. Refer to the article, "Build a Kit" from Ready.gov on what supplies to collect.

# PTP EDUCATION DAY & PEDIATRICIANS' LITTLE HELPERS

The best way to support PTP is to educate others about preventing unintentional childhood injuries and how to reduce children's anxiety around medical procedures. Educate those in your community about common accidents and their resulting injuries. Be sure to talk about how to prevent these incidents. One way you could reach out and educate your community is to hold a PTP Education Day! Bring in healthcare professionals, like pediatricians and nurses, to talk about these issues and what they do to help calm children down. In addition, you can make puppets for the pediatricians and nurses to use to act out the procedure, or have your key clubbers write storybooks about going to the doctor's office or hospital to ease their nerves. # PROJECT IDEAS

#### **COZY KIT**

The "Cozy Kit" would help comfort kids in hospitals and make their time there easier. Some items you could collect are:

- ★ Stuffed animals
- ★ Coloring books/Coloring supplies
- ★ Fidget toys/Stickers
- ★ Heart Pillows
- ★ Blankets
- ★ Cards

#### **GRIP/NON-SLIP SOCKS**

One of the most common injuries that lands young children in the hospital is falling. To prevent families from getting into a sticky situation, make no-slip socks with your clubs! For this project you will need to get socks and dimensional puffy fabric paint (important!). Refer to this video: <u>DIY Non-Slip Socks</u>.

#### THANK YOU BAGS

Taking care of kids in the hospital is a lot of work, so let's bee thankful to those frontline workers by making Thank-You bags! Saving lives is hard work, so let's keep them energized by providing them with something that could work as a little pick me up. You could fill the bags with:

- ★ Tea/coffee
- ★ Mug (look at dollar stores or thrift stores to get them cheap)
- ★ Snacks
- ★ Thank you card

You could have different themes for the bags, like a Relax Bag with candles, stress balls, etc. or a Self-Care Bag with skincare items. Something that would also be beneficial is a Sanitation Bag with hand sanitizer, cleaning wipes, etc. Bee creative!

# FUNDRAISER IDEAS

#### CHALLENGES, PIES FOR PTP, & TRIVIA

One of the best ways to raise support for the Pediatric Trauma Program is through educating those around us. A fun way to do so is by hosting and participating in challenges and games. 


