

While it is recommended to remain social distancing, members can go to a local park or neighborhood and help clean up the community! When planning, prepare supplies such as latex gloves and trash bags. Consider cleaning other locations, such as forests, gardens, or even the beach. Since members may not be able to meet up with their clubs, members can participate in nature cleanups with family members!

educational workshops

Gather resources about climate change and greenhouse gas emissions to educate members about how they can make a difference. Encourage small steps to reduce carbon emissions such as carpooling and recycling! Zoom, or any other video conferencing platform, is recommended for hosting online educational workshops.

plant a seed

Members can grow different flowers in their backyard and then partner with a local hospital or senior home to give bouquets to hospital patients or to those who are housebound. To ensure plant growth, members should research educational resources such as YouTube videos or articles online to assist with the process.

environmental awareness

Members can create graphics that educate others about the environment and what they can do to combat and reverse pollution. Things to include in the graphics may include statistics about pollution, health-related impacts, or ways to reduce emissions of harmful gasses. This can help save lives by promoting simple acts to encourage cleanliness of the Earth and spread awareness!

FUNDRAISER IDEAS

recyclables fundraiser

In order to raise money, members can collect recyclables to turn into funds for charity! Members can either drop off the recyclables themselves or the Lt. Governor can create a drop-off site for everyone. After the recyclables are dropped off at a recycle center, you can use the funds raised to donate to charity!

pennies for charity

While it may be difficult to organize an in-person fundraiser, there are many other ways to fundraise while social distancing. For example, members can collect loose change or cash and put it in a jar. Once the division is able to host in-person events again, this money can be donated to the charity of the division's choice. It can even be made into a competition to see which member can fill up their jar the fastest!
