- The Key Club Sandy Nininger Contest is a District contest that is also recognized on an International level. Eligible applicants must complete the application, as explained in the guidelines, and submit to the CNH Contest Archive for judging. At District Convention 2021 one distinguished contest winner will be announced.
- 1. Read the Sandy Nininger Contest guidelines.
- 2. Complete and compile an E-Portfolio. The E-Portfolio must include a cover page, nomination form, and supporting document. Please remember that all documentation must be in PDF form.
- E-mail the E-Portfolio to the CNH Contest Archive (<u>cnh.kccontests@gmail.com</u>). Submissions must be <u>received</u> by Tuesday, February 16th, 2021 by 11:59PM PST/HST.

SANDY NININGER CONTEST GUIDELINES RULES GOVERNING THE CNH KEY CLUB SANDY NININGER AWARD

When a Key Club was organized at Fort Lauderdale High School in January of 1936, Sandy Nininger became a charter member. He showed the same dedication to his work at that time as he would later show in battle. The school's athletic program had deteriorated and only fifteen candidates (including skinny Sandy) went out for the school football team. Home games seldom attracted more than a hundred spectators.

Sandy decided to change the situation and as chairman of his Key Club's entertainment committee, he arranged a dinner at the school cafeteria to which the town's businessmen were invited. The Key Clubbers asked for help to improve athletics in their community, and within a few weeks had the backing of the people of Fort Lauderdale. The city sold the school board a tract of land two blocks long and one block wide. An electric power company donated poles. Electricians gave their services. The rest of the community loaned money for equipment and a grandstand. Finally, a special football game was played before 1500 spectators. Football receipts eventually paid for the field, the fence around it, another grandstand, and all athletic expenses. In the spring of 1942, at a convention of Florida Key Clubs, Kiwanian Harold Martin of Fort Lauderdale proposed the Sandy Nininger Plaque as an award in his memory. As conceived by Harold, the medal was to be awarded to high school students who distinguished themselves by making the most of their opportunities—disregarding any school average or group standard. Thus, the award would recognize individuals in terms of their own abilities and weaknesses, opportunities and lack of opportunity.

In 1946, Key Club International formally named Lieutenant Alexander Nininger Jr. as the ideal Key Clubber. At the same time, the Sandy Nininger Plaque was also adopted. This plaque, with Sandy's likeness superimposed upon it, is now given by Key Clubs throughout America to the high school graduate who most exemplifies the tradition begun by Sandy Nininger.

The CNH Key Club Sandy Nininger Award is given to an outstanding, dues-paid, Key Club member with a minimum of fifty (50) service hours who has done an outstanding job in serving their home, school, and community. (<u>ALL</u> members who fit the requirements are qualified for this award.)

- (1) E-SIGNATURES: This application requires electronic signatures (E-Signatures) by the applicant and Faculty or Kiwanis Advisor. E-Signatures for this application are defined as names and contact information provided into the form. E-Signatures represent the fact that the individuals listed have approved the application and supporting documentation. These individuals may be contacted for further verification. Please do not use digital signatures.
- (2) E-PORTFOLIO: An E-Portfolio for this application is defined as one collective portfolio presenting the <u>best pieces</u> of documentation. This E-Portfolio should be a single PDF that includes all merged information.
 - It may not exceed 54 pages total.
- Label the file: Sandy Nininger_LastNameFirstName
- (3) SMALL FILE SIZES: Application submissions should have a small file size. The following are tips to maintaining this:
 - Include only the <u>best</u> samples of documentation
 - Compress all photos and files before use in e-portfolio
 - Compress the <u>final</u> e-portfolio file
- (4) The committee may select one person for this award. If in their estimation no one is worthy, this award will not be presented for that year. No one may receive this award more than once. Suitable awards will be presented.
- (5) The decisions of judging are final. No changes or re-evaluation will take places after the judges and the Member Recognition Chair have certified the results.
- (6) DUES-PAID: In order to be eligible to apply for this contest, you must be a dues-paid club by December 1st.

SANDY NININGER CONTEST RUBRIC

1. Cover Page Page Limit: 1

- a. Name of Nominee
- b. Position and Term
- c. Home Club, Division, and Region
- d. Picture of Applicant

Nomination Form Page Limit: 2 | (5 pts max)

- e. Name of Nominee
- f. Home Club, Club Number, Division, and Region
- g. Name of Nominator
- h. Table of Contents
- i. Statement of Nomination | Word Limit: 1,000

2. Dividers Page Limit: 8 | (5 pts max)

A one-page divider is required to precede each section. It should include the following information:

- a. Section Title
- Personal Reflection: addresses personal growth, accomplishments, explanation of section, list of evidence not included, or other details that may assist judges in determining scoring.

Letter(s) of Recommendation Page Limit: 3 (10 pts max)

- a. These are used as testimonies to support your overall E-Portfolio. Letters will portray the efforts you set forth to serving the District, as well as the growth you demonstrated throughout your time in Key Club.
- b. Maximum of 3 Letters of Recommendations.

4. Commitment to Service Page Limit: 4 | (10 pts max)

Key Club International is a service organization.
It is important to showcase the applicant's commitment to service for the full duration of Key Club membership.

5. Commitment to the Key Club Core Values Page Limit: 10 | (10 pts max)

a. The Key Club International core values include caring, character building, inclusiveness, and leadership. A Sandy Nininger Award nominee should have demonstrated all core values throughout his/her duration of Key Club membership.

6. Proof of Attendance Page Limit: 4 | (10 pts max)

- a. Identify all of the Key Club and/or Kiwanis Family meetings and events for the applicant spanning his or her entire relationship with the Kiwanis Family.
- Active Membership Involvement & Accomplishments Page Limit: 10 | (10 pts max)
 - a. Showcase the applicant's involvement and accomplishments as a Key Club member in any or all applicable sections of the following levels: Club Level Division & Region
 - District Level International Level
- 8. Kiwanis Family Fellowship & Unity Page Limit: 3 | (5 pts max)
 - a. Showcase the applicant's active participation in establishing relationships as a member of the Kiwanis Family

9. Personal Contributions Page Limit: 4 | (10 pts max)

a. Showcase how the applicant distinguished himself/herself by making the most of his or her opportunities.

10. Inspirational Qualities Page Limit: 4 | (10 pts max)

a. Provide testimonies and examples how the applicant has been an inspiration that will assist the judges in this evaluation process.

11. Graphic Standards | (10 pts)

a. Your E-Portfolio will be judged on sections 1 through 10. As a whole, it must demonstrate your knowledge of **Graphic Standards**. The proper and accurate demonstration of Graphic Standards is worth **10 points**.

12. File Size | (5 pts)

a. If the E-Portfolio **file size** is less than or equal to 10 MB and 54 pages, it will earn **5 points**.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. What does CC mean? How do I CC myself?

CC stands for "carbon copy." To carbon copy is to send an identical E-mail to the given recipient to save as a copy. By clicking the button with the letters "CC" on it while sending an email out, you will be able to type in the address to which you would like to send a carbon copy—in this case, your own.

2. How can I create an E-Portfolio?

Google Slides is a good and free application to use; you can also use Publisher, Word, Photoshop, and PowerPoint. When saving a file in Google Slides, go to "File", then "Download" and you will see the PDF option. To find more information on how to make an e-portfolio visit the <u>CNH Youtube Channel.</u>

3. What is an E-Signature?

Send an email to respective people you would like to receive signatures from, asking permission whether you may include their names as proof of your efforts. After their approval, you may input their names. There is no physical signature. It is the name and contact information of the necessary individuals, <u>typed</u>.

4. How do I compress photos or PDF files?

(Keep in mind, a "JPEG" photo is already small enough, and would not need any compressions).

5. Do all sections need to follow Graphic Standards?

The whole E-Portfolio needs to utilize graphic standards. This applies to any documents that are added into the E-Portfolio as well, apart from Letter of Recommendation and anything sent to you. 6. May I use pictures in my Dividers?

You may use any pictures or graphics as long as they are appropriate in order to showcase, but you MUST have a personal reflection in your Divider. Be sure to add captions when appropriate.

7. How can I merge PDF files?

Use online applications, such as <u>www.pdfmerge.com</u>.

8. How do I transfer the forms on this file, such as the nomination form or proof of attendance, to my e-portfolio?

There are multiple ways you can transfer the ways, but here are some easier ways. You can access the google slides links to the single PDF files of each form in the rubric. Then, you would press file > make a copy. Now, you can fill out the form and copy and paste the slide into your e-portfolio. Other ways include using Adobe Acrobat with the single file PDFs in the rubric or using Microsoft Word.
