

"On March 15, the Key Club International Board unanimously recommended canceling the convention because health and travel restrictions made gathering at Walt Disney World Resort® inadvisable and impractical. The KYP Board made its decision on March 18, 2021.

"These decisions are never easy," said Paul Palazzolo, 2020-21 Kiwanis Youth Programs Board chair. "We understand our student leaders were planning to enjoy fellowship and education in person. Key Club International is currently planning another online Key Club Summer Leadership

Conference where more students from around the world can enjoy meeting each other and learning together."

The Key Club International bylaws provide for the Key Club International Council to convene and elect the 2021-22 Key Club International Board. Details are being finalized. The international council consists of the board of trustee members and district governors."






