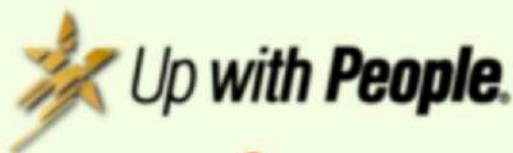
## *Key Club International* **MAJOR EMPHASIS**

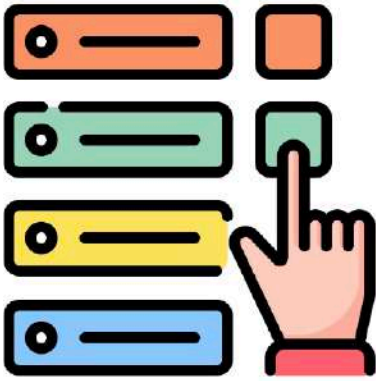

# Club Elections



As the term comes to an end, the time to elect the 2021-2022 Club Officers draws near. BEE sure to follow all rules to ensure that you are holding a valid election! Begin hosting club elections from now until February 27th!



## President

The President presides over the Club Board of Directors. They are responsible for holding club board & general meetings, delegating tasks, holding club elections, and more!

There may be multiple Vice Presidents assigned to different roles and responsibilities. It is preferred to have no more than seven.

## Vice President

Club secretaries are responsible for handling club records, submitting the Club Monthly Report Form to their respective Lt. Governor, updating club bylaws, and much more!

## Secretary

Treasurers are responsible for making sure the club's finances are in check. Whether it be collecting and sending dues to international or keeping track of the annual budget.

Editors and Historians document everything that the club does. Through videos, pictures, social media, and even submissions to the Division News Editor help showcase what each club has been up to!



### **EDUCATION AND TIPS**

**To ensure that your Club is hosting a valid election, BEE sure to follow proper procedures down below!**

✔ Only dues-paid members are able to vote! Anyone that is **NOT** a dues-paid member can sit and watch.

✔ If there are more than two candidates running for a position, a nomination conference should be held beforehand to reduce the number of candidates to two.

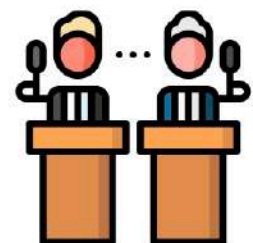
✔ Candidates may create a literature to distribute at the Club elections, but they may **not** advertise nor promote themselves or else they will be **immediately disqualified**.

#### NOTE:

Don't forget to check out the club elections guide on the CyberKey for more information!

✔ After hosting a valid election, ensure that the Club Secretary updates the "Club Elections" tab on the MRF,

✔ Train your officer elects and leave a legacy you're proud of!

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Make sure you are on track to fulfill all your highschool credits in the correct courses to receive your diploma! If your grades are not what they need to be, some things to consider are:

- Do you have a good learning environment?
- Are you limiting time on distractions?
- Are you taking care of your physical and emotional health?
- Are you asking for help (advisory/office hours)?

## 4-YEAR COLLEGE

Monitor your "to-do" list and email (including junk/spam) carefully. Missing a "to-do" item or not meeting a deadline can be grounds to revoke your admissions offer.

Received an unsatisfactory grade (grade below "C")...what to do? Depends on the college. Make sure you read the information they send. Many want you to contact them once admitted to notify of an unsuccessful grade or schedule change.

## FINANCIAL AID

Submit your FAFSA (or Dream Act) by *March 2nd, 2021*.

### Next Steps:

Create a Webgrants for Students account to view and manage your Cal Grant. On this site you have to accept your award offer and indicate when you are a graduate.

You will receive a financial aid package from each college to review before making your final decision. Watch your email (including junk/spam) carefully as well as your college portals as this information may come virtually.

## HAVE NO POST-HIGH SCHOOL PLANS?

If you do not know what your post-high school plans are, definitely look into other options such as:

- Regional Occupational Centers
- Apprenticeships
- Private Career & Technical Schools
- U.S. Military
- AmeriCorps
- California Conservation Corps
- Job Corps

You can also review or complete Naviance career assessments to find your niche!



# KIWANIS PLAYGROUND



The Kiwanis Club of Raleigh, North Carolina was able to successfully complete their two service projects- refurbishing an old playground and building a new one. The project began as a commemoration to the club's 100 year anniversary, which was approaching in just 5 years. The club fundraised \$100,000 to refurbish the Sassafra All Children's Playground (pictured above).



Furthermore, over the course of the 5 years, the Kiwanis club was able to raise \$125,000 and with the help of a city bond to cover additional costs, the club renovated the Kiwanis Park. The Kiwanis Partnership with Landscape Structures Inc. greatly helped as well, being that it provided discounts for both Kiwanis and the city. The new playground equipment was unveiled at a ribbon cutting ceremony fall 2019 and was popular among many children and families, before the COVID-19 pandemic.

# MARCH OF DIMES

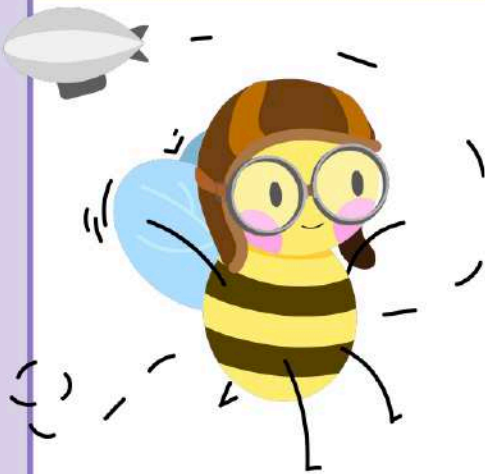
## background

The mission of the March of Dimes is to improve the health of babies by preventing birth defects, premature birth and infant mortality. Due to the efforts of the March of Dimes, the rate of premature birth has recently declined to about 9.6 percent! With the organization's efforts, thousands of babies have been saved from premature birth.

Because of March of Dimes, health care costs were able to be reduced, saving the nation billions of dollars. Despite this progress, about 380,000 babies continue to be born prematurely every year.

YOU can make a change in these babies' lives by taking action through fundraisers and educating the community about these issues.

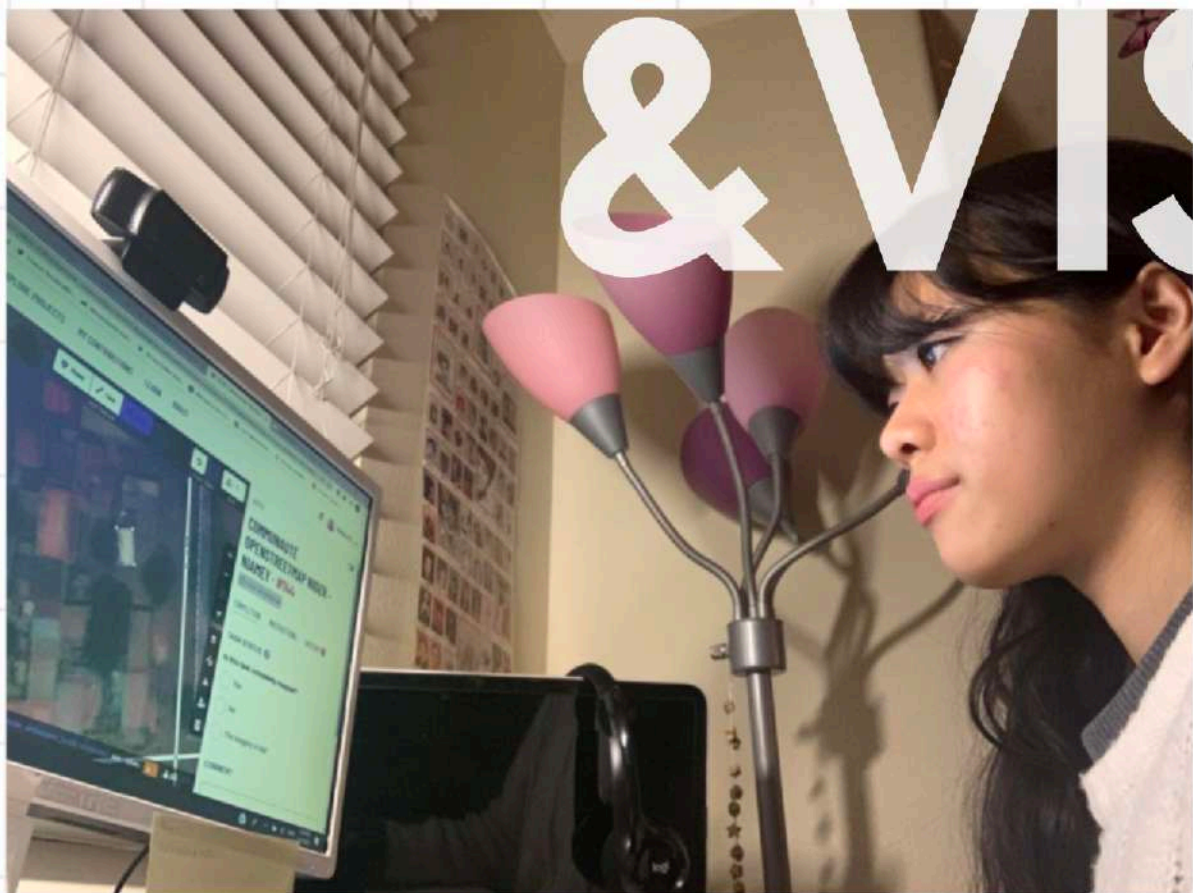

## **HYGIENE DRIVE**

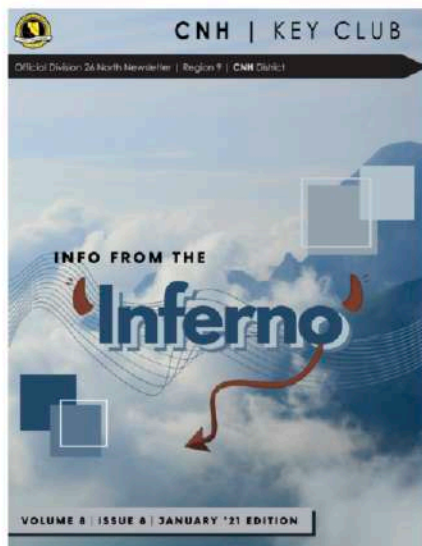
### **DIVISION 4 EAST, CANYON | JACQUELINE TRAN**
