



#### healthcare hallo-grams

"We planned this event two weeks prior to the event day. We wanted to show our appreciation and gratitude towards healthcare workers during this hard time. Since it is October, we took the idea of Unicef and wanted to educate more people about it! After our key club general meeting, we help our project event for one and a half hours. During this time, we played music for our members while they worked on their cards. We had them make at least three cards where they put positive notes and puns on the front, with an educational note about Unicef and Key Club on the back! This event was a simple one but it is able to brighten up people's day, which is worth it. The project was successful in which our members enjoyed doing it and was able to showcase their art skills and write notes towards people that they might really look up to or respect. One certain aspect our service projects can improve on is the timing, where some of our members finish their cards very fast and did not make more. This might be a problem because they are not using the full time wisely, but we can take this and think of other ways we can expand our requirements so that the members can use the whole time more efficiently."





#### unicef donation collection

"Usually we use Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF boxes to collect donations throughout the month and especially on Halloween. However, due to the ongoing pandemic situation, this was not ideal to do this year. Initially, we were going to use the online donation box that UNICEF had set up but we realized that we had no way of knowing who was making the donations. Therefore, we decided that we would have members collect donations (safely) and we would have a collection station for contactless collection. Although not pertaining directly to MNT, we also participated in UNICEF Math Challenge that raises money for UNICEF as a whole through math guiz guestions online. This project gave our club a new method for donation collection if we ever need to fundraise for charity again this way. We had a number of donations, not as many as we usually do, but it was not bad considering the current pandemic situation. I think we could have motivated members more to collect donations. The UNICEF Math Challenge is something we can continue to do even after the pandemic is aware. Since we were always doing projects in-person, we never looked into many virtual projects. However, this Math Challenge is accessible to and doable for everyone so I can see us continuing this project into the future."

#### bedwars fundraiser

"This project was planned out a month in advance so that we could have a sufficient time to advertise and accumulate more people to help us donate to PTP and UNICEF. We were able to receive help from a few of our generous club members who kindly set up a Discord for participants to communicate and create a Minecraft Bedwars server for us. After careful consideration and lots of discussions, we were able to release a registration form, advertisement, and allow anyone to join our event. Members who wanted to register as an individual would give a donation of \$3 and those who wanted to register as a team would give a donation of \$2 per player. On the day of the competition, participants were grouped into their respective teams on Discord and the teams followed a bracket system throughout the duration of the tournament. As the tournament came to an end, we congratulate our winning team and rewarded their efforts with a cash prize."
