

- 8.5 in x 11 in (standard document)
- Cover Page
  - Must have photo of applicant (if needed)
  - Include the applicant/club name, term, division, and region
  - Pencil, logo, and wordart
  - Follow the appropriate fonts
  - Nomination Form
  - Statement of nominee (if needed)
  - Submit your compressed PDF file in an email by the deadline to the Recognition Archive





# SOCIAL MEDIA STANDARDS

Safekey. Content.



Songs labeled without E are not explicit; these songs are allowed.

Songs labeled with an E are explicit, which are not allowed.

Notice the song boxed in red is labeled with an E, which cannot be used because it is explicit.

## **FOLLOWING SAFEKEY RULES**

#### Music Choices

No explicit words or profanity allowed in songs

#### **Posts**

- What's Not Okay
  - No profanity or explicit words
  - Views on a topic that can lead to conflict
- · What is Okay
  - Post positive and friendly messages
  - Appropriate photos

### CONTENT

#### Promotional for events

- Explain how events (FRS, FRN, DCON, OTC, RTC, etc.) are beneficial besides "meeting friends"
  - Emphasis on the benefits (training, fundraising for PTP, learning leadership skills, etc.)

#### **Fundraising**

- Strictly cannot use words such as "sell" or "buy" because Key Club is a non profit organization
- Use words such as "donating"

#### Educational/Informational Materials

- Utilize the CNH Cyberkey to ensure all information is factual.
  - If information is not available on the CNH Cyberkey, check in with the respective officer.

## what is doon?

District Convention (DCON) is an annual event held to **celebrate** the achievements of the term, **elect** the new District Executive Board, **attend** educational workshops, **meet** new Key Clubbers across California, Nevada, and Hawaii, and welcome the new term!

### when & where is doon?

Location: Reno Grand Sierra Resort (2500 E 2nd St, Reno, NV 89595)

## why should i attend doon?

DCON is a weekend packed full of unforgettable experiences, including:

- Learn more about Key Club through educational workshops hosted by fellow members
- Recognize and celebrate the hard work and dedication of members, clubs, officers, and advisors
- Watch the CNH talent show and listen to a special keynote speaker
- Dance the night away at Governor's Ball

- Experience the bittersweet ending of the term by saying goodbye to the 2021-2022 District Board and welcoming the 2022-2023 District Board

## transportation & hotels

#### How will transportation work?

Transportation costs will vary based on the <u>mode of transportation</u> and your <u>distance from Grand Sierra Resort</u>. Examples include: **cars, trains**, **airplanes**, and **division-wide buses**.

#### What hotels can we stay at?

All attendees are required to stay at the **Grand Sierra Resort** (2500 E 2nd St, Reno, NV 89595).

## registration

#### What should I complete during registration?

In addition to completing the registration for your club's attendees, you should complete SAA Registration (2 per club), Delegate Registration (2 per club), and Advisors should book hotels for themselves and their Key Club members.

#### What does the registration fee cover?

DCON registration will cover your Saturday breakfast, lunch, and dinner, Sunday breakfast, DCON souvenirs, and all Convention activities.

Be sure to bring extra money for Friday night's dinner, meals during traveling, and other snacks you plan to purchase during DCON 2022!



#### How much is on-time registration and when is it due?

On-time registration is \$215. It is due by February 11, 2022.

#### How much is Late Registration and when is it due?

Late Registration is \$255. It is due by February 25, 2022.

#### Who must pay the registration fee?

All attendees (i.e. members and chaperones) must pay the registration fee.

## safety measures

#### What is the Code of Conduct?

The Code of Conduct:

- Can be found on the CyberKey
- Must be filled out by every attendee to show that they agree with all of the District's policies
- Must be followed by all attendees

#### Will chaperones require background checks?

All chaperones MUST complete a background check prior to DCON

# GET INVOLVED

### sergeant-at-arms

## What is an SAA Captain? GENERAL

- SAA stands for Sergeant-At-Arms and they are responsible for enforcing the Code of Conduct
- SAA Captains are a group of appointed volunteers who lead the enforcement of the Code of Conduct and ensure that DCON runs smoothly.

#### SAA CAPTAIN DUTIES

- Overlook SAA volunteers and helping the SAA Coordinator with any tasks prior to DCON.
- Monitor all members' behavior and enforce DCON rules.

#### "How do I become an SAA Captain?"

Information about SAA Captain applications will be released before DCON. After the application process, SAA Captain Candidates will be interview by SAA Coordinator, Raelynn Esguerra.

## delegate

#### What is a delegate?

Delegates vote for the 2022-2023 District Executive Board Each club in attendance at DCON MUST have TWO registered delegates.



#### How do I become a delegate?

If interested, speak with your club officer board about becoming a delegate for your club. Your club will then register you as a delegate once agreed upon.

### presenters

#### Who presents workshops at DCON?

YOU! District Board members, guest speakers, and members like you can present workshops at DCON to better educate the District.

#### How do I become a presenter?

Information about presenter applications will be released before DCON. After the application process, presenter candidates will be interviewed by the Membership Development & Education Committee.

# REMINDERS

## before you go ...

- Double check that your chaperone has booked hotels and secured transportation
- Make sure that you're properly registered, including each club having two SAAs and two delegates
- Work out chaperone arrangements so that you match the 10:1 student-to-chaperone same gender ratio per club/division
- Use the DCON packing list to ensure you've packed everything you'll need for DCON

Hey, you! First of all, I applaud you for taking the initiative to run for a position—taking that first step is one of the hardest parts! Now, have faith in yourself! One of the most effective ways to capture your members' attention is to have confidence. If you are presenting a speech, stand tall, back straight, face forward, make eye contact, and speak slowly and clearly; your goal is to reach each and every one of your members, even those at the back of the room. When crafting your speech, be sure to include clear, concise, and specific goals. Rather than simply stating a general goal, explain HOW you will reach it! In addition, convey your qualities as a leader through briefly explaining personal experiences or actions; actions speak for themselves! And lastly, no matter what happens, know that a simple title does not define your worth as a leader—you'll have exponential opportunities to grow and flourish! Good luck! <3

## CNH | KEY CLUB

#### CLUB ELECTIONS PROCEDURE

NOTE: procedures may vary depending on the clubs adopted bylaws. Club elections should take no earlier than two months and no later than one month prior to District Convention. This will allot for sufficient time for elects to register for District Convention.

- On the day of elections, the club advisor as well as a quorum, or minimum of 50% of paid dues members, should be present. Before the elections take place, the host, the club president, unless he or she is running for a position, will introduce the candidates of each club office. The host will then explain the rules to the members.
- 2. Literatures, if produced, will be distributed.
- Each candidate will give a speech within a set time limit. All the other candidates running for that same
  office must remain outside of the room until it is his or her turn.
- Immediately following the speech, the members can ask questions to the candidate for a given amount
  of time. The host will regulate the questions and ask questions to the candidates if there are none from
  the members.
- During this time, the members and club officers should be taking notes or the information presented by the candidates to better assist them when voting.
- When the time for caucusing is up, the candidate is sent out of the room and the next candidate for the same office will enter.
- The same procedure will continue until all candidates for that office have had a chance to speak and answer questions. Then, the procedure repeats until all candidates of all offices have spoken and answered questions.
- Once speeches are completed, the dues-paid members are given ballots to vote. Members may vote
  no more or less than one candidate per office. If this occurs, the ballot will not count. There should be no
  discussion during this time.
- After all the ballots have been collected, the club officers and club advisor will count the votes for each candidate. The club president's ballot will be counted unless there is a fie.
- 10. In the case that there are more than two candidates for a particular office, a club will hold a Nominating Conference to narrow the candidates down to the best candidates. Those who have passed this conference may give a shorter speech or answer more questions. The club will then proceed to an additional voting with the same rules as before.
- 11. Club officers should either notify the candidates of the results before or during an upcoming meeting.

#### HOW TO RUN FOR DISTRICT OFFICE

Running for District Office is a big deal. Available positions are: District Governor, District Secretary, and District Treasurer. If you are interested in running for any of the listed positions, contact your Lieutenant Governor and Region Advisor. Only those who attend District Office Training Conference may run for District Office.

- Register and attend District Office Candidate Training Conference. DOCTC attendance is MANDATORY for interested candidates.
  - Register online
  - Attend District Office Candidate's Training Conference. Make sure you are constantly checking the CyberKey for dates under Resources > District Officers > Running for District or International Office
  - c. A confirmation email will be sent out on behalf of administration in late December to early January to confirm your attendance and travel plans. Constantly check your email so you can confirm as your DOCTC assignment will be in this email. Complete this assignment prior to attending the event.
- Complete the "Intent to Run" online registration process (cnhkeyclub.org > Resources > District Officers > Running for District or International Office).
  - a. Please note that this registration is different from CTC. Registering for DOCTC does not mean you are filing your intent to run. DOCTC is so you can learn more about the position, rather than declaring candidacy.
- Complete the District Office Service Agreement Forms (cnhkeyclub.org > Resources > District Officers > Running for District or International Office).
  - Must be signed by: Candidate, Parent/Guardian, Kiwanis Advisor, Faculty Advisor, School Principal, and Region Advisor
  - There are dates on the CyberyKey and the forms. Forms must be received by SLP Director Timothy Cunning both electronically and physically.
- Complete the CNH Candidate Basic Profile Response form (cnhkeyclub.org > Resources > District Officers > Running for District or International Office).
  - Candidate's Profile includes the following: elected and appointed positions, awards and honors, and responses to given questions.
- Complete and submit your personalized literature to <u>pie.chair@cnhkeyclub.org</u> on the date given on the CyberKey.
- You must be physically present at elections held at District Convention in order to run. Register as an attendee with your home club. District Office candidates do not receive discounts.
- Prepare your speech. Make sure to include your goals, qualifications, etc.
- Prepare for the caucus session immediately following your speech at elections. You can practice with the sample questions provided at District Office Candidate Training Conference manual. You can also use the duties of the office you are seeking as a guide.

#### pediatric trauma program

By providing community outreach and materials, providing grants to partner hospitals, and holding projects to address pediatric trauma, the program aims to reduce the number of children who are killed or injured by trauma. # december spotlight on service program providing basic needs



#### socks and sanitation drive

Willow Glen | R17 | D12S

"This was a Socks and Sanitation Drive, where students would also work to make care packages over the course of 4 days. This entire event centered around community support during the winter season. Upon doing a Community Assessment with different organizations and communities in San Jose, we discovered that the winter season is especially difficult for the low income and unhoused community in San Jose. We also made sure to ask them directly what they would find to be most helpful during the winter. Warm clothing but especially socks, and sanitation supplies such as pads, hand sanitizer, tampons, and period cups were all supplies that many low income and unhoused people don't have consistent access to, so we wanted to help support them. We then worked with Feed the Block for distributing these care packages once made. Each care package contained 5 tampons, 5 pads, 2 pairs of socks, miscellaneous clothing, a supportive card; the bag itself was also decorated with encouraging messages and pretty drawings. Ultimately, if it makes someone feel happy, we wanted to help make that possible. By the end of the event we raised \$125 dollars, which went into getting more supplies and made 300 care packages!!"







#### holiday food bank El Camino | R17 | D34N

"With some research from our service committee, we were able to come across this event within our area. This project greatly impacted our club as it was a service event that we have never done before. This made many of our members want to come back and participate in unique service events like this. I would say that this project was very successful since we had high attendance and everyone who went had a good time, which was expressed in their active submissions in their articles and visuals. Additionally, our members were rewarded by receiving their own share of the food after the drive-through was over.

Overall, this was a fun event and we will be definitely planning more things like this in the future."





## caroling for cans

Homestead | R17 | D34S

"This event is an annual division-wide tradition. We first got the event approved by our school's ASB and received attendance confirmation from our faculty and Kiwanis advisors, who would be chaperoning the event. We also needed to place bags in front of the houses in our neighborhood so that community members could put cans inside their given bags and leave them outside for us to collect. We incorporated a service event into our club meeting where members drew 100 flyers advertising our canned food drive. The week prior to the event, officers stapled each flyer onto a bag and distributed each package around our neighborhood. During the actual event, Key Clubbers walked along 3 different routes and caroled to houses while collecting their donations. In the end, we collected over 200 canned foods that will be donated to the Community Services Agency of Mountain View & Los Altos in order to support local families struggling with food insecurity during the holiday season."

# operation christmas Gretchen Whitney | R03 | D30S

Operation Christmas is an annual drive that Whitney High School holds to support the Salvation Army. They take in 8 families to provide clothing, canned foods, gifts, and monetary donations. Our Vice President is in charge of planning the event, so she gave the cabinet members their duties, communicated with the Kiwanis family and planned out the logistics of the event. The cabinet members were put in charge of homerooms to go around and give speeches to collect monetary and canned food donations. After the 2 week canned food and donation drive, the cabinet members and homeroom representatives used the money to buy extra clothing items and gifts that these families requested. When the families were taken in by the Salvation Army and Whitney Key Club, they were unable to receive help from any other organizations, meaning that we impacted them greatly with the generous contributions from our school!
