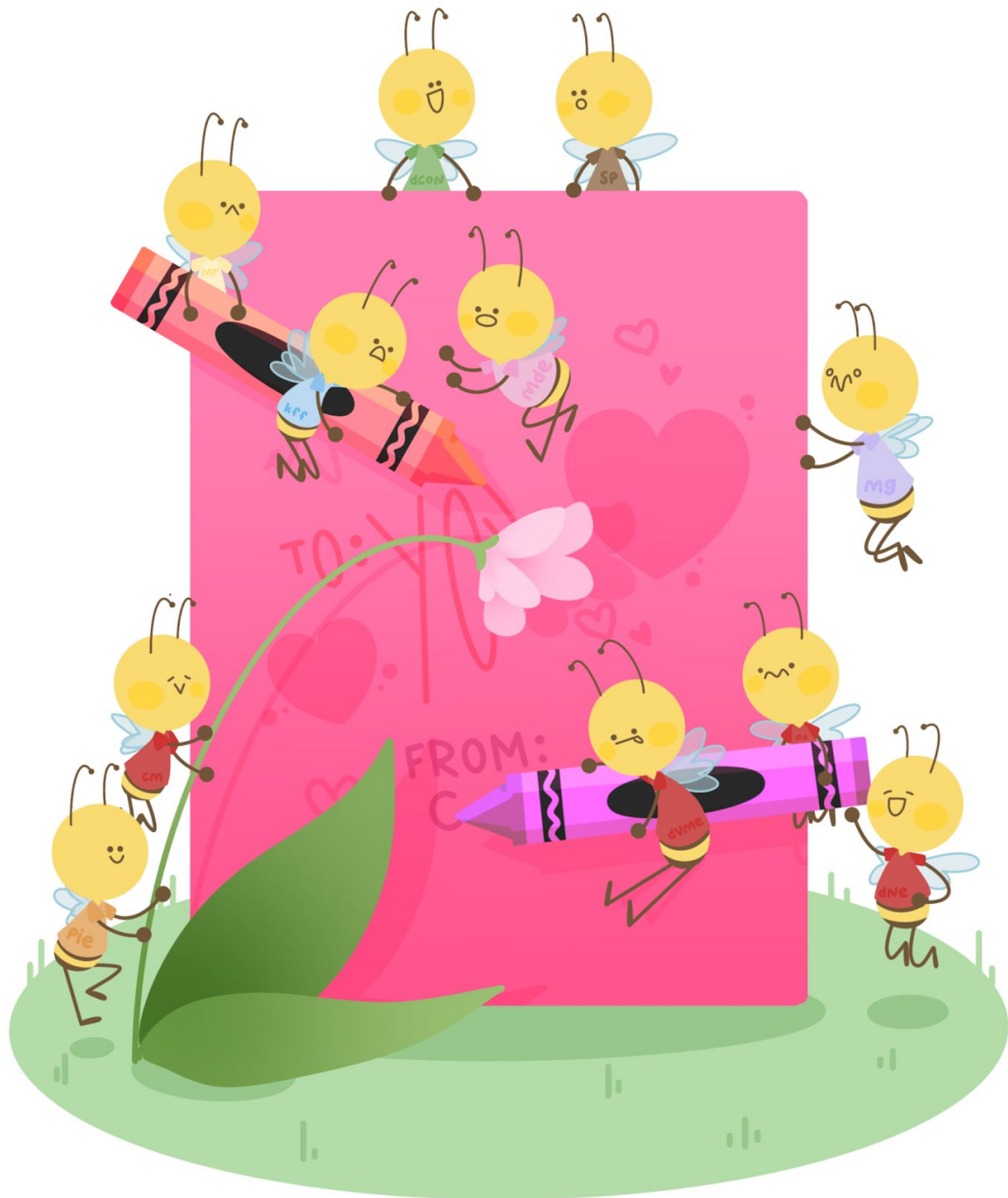

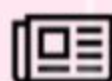



- Only checks will be accepted mailed to the **CNH Kiwanis District Office**, no exceptions. Please do not mail cash.
 - **CNH Kiwanis District Office, P O Box 1327, Rancho Cucamonga, CA 91729**
- Remember, the **chaperone to student ratio** is **1:10** (gender-specific). All chaperones are required to get a **Kiwanis Background check**. It can take up to **2 weeks** to process, so remind your chaperones to get it done **ASAP**. More information can be found on the registration website.
- All attendees **MUST** book their hotels through the hotel housing link on the registration website. You must stay at one of the **approved 2023 DCON hotels**.

officer positions



PRESIDENT

Oversees all club activities, leads meetings, represents the club, delegates tasks to officers, etc.



VICE PRESIDENT

Aids the President and fills in when necessary, assists with planning events, supports fellow officers, etc.



SECRETARY

Records service hours and meeting minutes, submits the MRF, tracks meeting attendance, etc.



TREASURER

Prepares budgets, maintains club financial records, plans fundraisers, collects and submits dues, etc.



EDITOR

Publicizes club activities, takes photos at events, submits Articles & Visuals, manages social media, etc.



**Positions & duties may differ depending on the club.*

OF PIE SLICE OF PI

candidate requirements



- Must be **dues-paid** & in **good standing**
- Must submit any **required forms** to Club President & Faculty Advisor at least **one week** prior to the election
 - Forms depend on the club (contact your President for more information!)
 - EX. Service Agreement, Intent to Run Form, Medical Release Form, etc.
- **NO CAMPAIGNING!**

campaigning: dos & don'ts

DO

Candidates are **ABLE TO** say "yes" when asked whether or not they are a candidate.

DON'T

Candidates are **NOT ABLE TO** distribute any campaigning materials or have anyone campaign for them.

EX. No posters, social media posts, gifts, etc.

preparing - tips



SPEECH

- Write a speech to present to the club
- **Memorize** the speech as much as possible, but it is okay to use **note cards**
- Outline specific **goals** and how you will achieve them
 - *THINK: What are the club's areas of weakness? What can be improved? What specific methods can be used to address this?*
- Explain your **qualifications** and **reason** for running for the position
 - *Why is Key Club so important to you?*

CAUCUS QUESTIONS

- Prepare for caucus (Q&A) questions from members
- **Review** potential caucus questions
 - *Sample questions can be found at cnhkeyclub.org > Resources > Policy & Elections*
- **Practice** coming up with answers on the spot
 - *BEE specific!*
 - *Ask a trusted adult to help you practice answering questions*

★ election process

REQUIREMENTS

- Election must be held at least **45 days** before DCON
- **Quorum** (50% or more of dues-paid members present) must be met for a valid election to be held

PROCEDURE

1. Candidates will give a **speech** and then answer questions during a **caucus** session.
 - a. Length depends on the club.
 - b. Other candidates cannot be in the room when a candidate is speaking.
 - c. Clubs can host a Nominating Conference to narrow down the candidates to 2 individuals per office.
2. All **dues-paid members** are given a **ballot** to vote for each office.
3. All ballots will be **collected** and **counted** by the club advisors.
4. **Results** will be announced either at the end or at another club meeting.

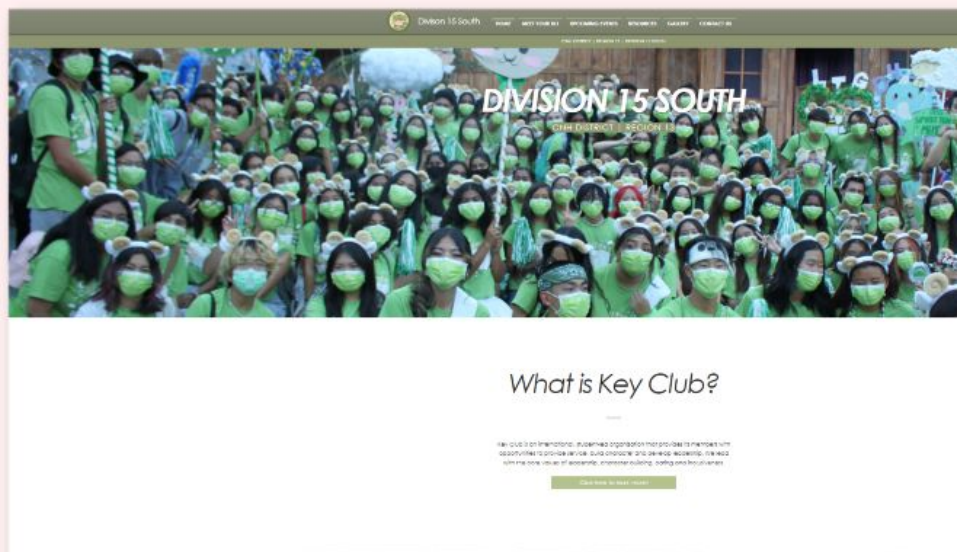

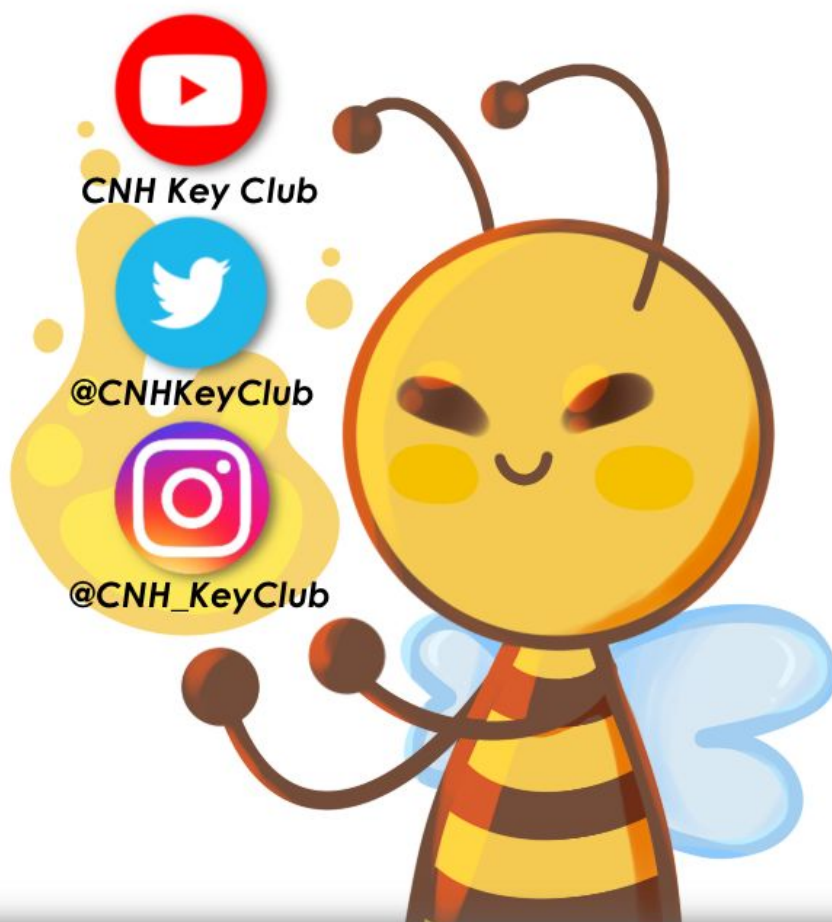
