



 - a. Key Club International is sponsored by Kiwanis International. This section must focus on how you as President, Vice President, or Treasurer have interacted or collaborated with your sponsoring Kiwanis Club and Kiwanis family members.
 - b. Include, at most, 4 examples.

Member of the Year

- 1. Kiwanis Family Fellowship & Unity
 - a.Page Limit: 3 | (10 pts max)
 - b.Include at least three examples of the applicant's active participation in establishing strong relationships as a member of the Kiwanis Family during the District administrative year.

Most Improved Club

- 1. Kiwanis Family Relations | (10 pts max)
 - a.List up to five (5) of the most productive functions that have improved relations with Kiwanis, Aktion, Circle K, KIWIN'S, Builders, and K-Kids.
 - b. Complete all statistical information requested on the form.
 - c. Any activities in this section may not be included or repeated in any other section.

Member Recognition Program (MRP)

- 1. Kiwanis Family Event
 - a.The Kiwanis Family includes: Kiwanis, Circle K, Key Club, KIWIN'S, Aktion, Builders, and K-Kids. To count as a Kiwanis Family event, please refer to the "Interclub" section below for membership attendance requirements. Ex: Attending a Kiwanis meeting, DCM, etc.
- Interclub: Any event hosted by another Key Club/K-Family organization.
 - a. If your club has 20 or fewer members, at least TWO members present from your Key Club and at least TWO members present from the other Kiwanis Family Organization.
 - b. If your club has 21-30 members, at least THREE members present from your Key Club and at least THREE members present from the other Kiwanis Family Organization.
 - c. If your club has 31 or more members, at least FOUR members present from your Key Club and at least FOUR members present from the other Kiwanis Family Organization.

WHAT IS CONCLAVE?

A division meeting in which a Lieutenant Governor (LTG) is elected to serve the division as a district & international liaison for one term. Here, candidates are chosen to be their division's LTG elect by conclave delegates upon the completion of their candidate speeches and caucus session. This event takes place in January-February. A region may choose to organize multiple conclaves at one location, so be sure to reach out to your club president or current Lieutenant Governor for more information regarding your division's conclave!

HOW DO I PARTICIPATE?

Depending on your club, you may have the opportunity to be a delegate at your conclave, where in which you will be responsible for listening to LTG candidates' speeches, asking them questions about their candidacy during caucus, and voting on who should be your division's next Lieutenant Governor! Make sure to attend your division's conclave to witness the special moment your 2022-23 Lieutenant Governor is elected!

HOW DO I BECOME A CANDIDATE?

Those interested in becoming a candidate should have attended their region's respective Candidate Training Conference (CTC). If you would like more information about the LTG election and candidacy process, please reach out to your division's current Lieutenant Governor and Region Advisor. *NOTE*: Depending on your division and the date of your conclave, you may not be allowed to run if you have not attended CTC.
