K-Kids

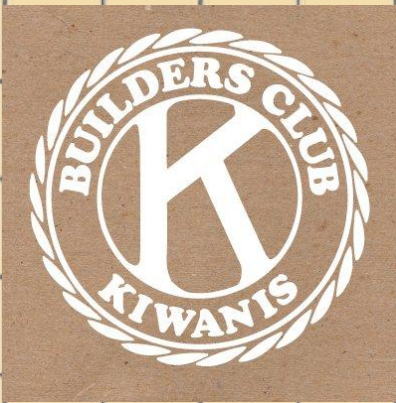

K-Kids And Builders Club



Builders Club

Builders Club is one of the largest service-aimed clubs for middle school students in the world. There are over 45,000 members in Builders Club and they have learned leadership skills and served their community. Much like Key Club, Builders Clubs partner with March of Dimes and UNICEF to have fundraisers. Builders Club is structured on a club level and is another branch of Kiwanis.



Builders Club is a student-led organization which allows middle school students to become early leaders. This is often the first step into joining Key Club for some!



The Chartering Process

1. Proposals

- Communicate between Key Club and sponsoring Kiwanis Club
- Create a timeline with a Kiwanis Advisor about funding the club and the necessary steps to do so

2. Communication

- Reach out to schools that may be interested in having a club in their community
- Educate parents and students about the Kiwanis Family and our values
- Use different methods of communication: email, group chats, text messages, etc.

3. Find Members

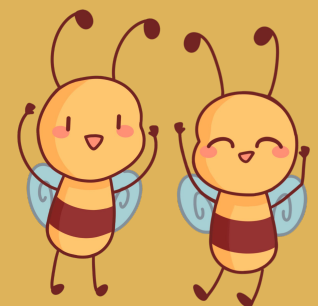
- Make flyers and advertise the Builders Club/K-Kids
- Find a middle/elementary school liaison who will be informative
- Host informational lunch meetings

4. Organize the club

- Have officer elections and trainings
- Create new bylaws and utilise middle/elementary school liaisons

5. Fill out paperwork

- Look for the required documents and complete them with the help of Kiwanis

June SOS Recognition - Health & Safety

For this event, our Kiwanis advisor, Barbara Rugeley connected us with the Human Department Services for the city of Claremont. Every two years, the city of Claremont is required to gather information about the city's Wilderness Park so it can continue to receive grants and funding from the government. Our club initially contacted the Human Services Manager, and told them we would be interested in helping the city gather information about the park. The Human Services Manager then responded to our email, saying they would love our help, and gave us a site in which would allow our Key Club volunteers to sign up and debrief them on what we would do. Essentially, our volunteers would be placed at different locations in the Wilderness Park with surveys to hand out to people along the trails and gather some basic general information. We would then turn these surveys into the city and they would use these to prove that the Wilderness Park is receiving enough traffic and people into the location as proof that it is reasonable to continuing funding.

Overall, the project was extremely successful! We had ran out of surveys the city gave to us to distribute. We had twelve volunteers from our home club to participate, resulting thirty-six hours of service. The only issue we had was that more volunteers were interested in the project, but we had hit the max capacity of available volunteers! This service project is relevant to "Health and Safety" as this Wilderness Park is often used by residents of Claremont and neighboring cities to exercise and improve their health. It also is a place of safety for wildlife as the park is extremely large and known to be home of deer and other sorts of wildlife.

June SOS Recognition - Health & Safety

Our club planned this project by asking members to bring hygiene supplies such as small bottles of soaps, toothpaste, shampoo, hand sanitizer, masks, small towels and more. After collecting all the supplies, we assembled all of the supplies into small kits and made greeting cards with nice notes to add to the bags. We packed over 50 bags worth of supplies during this project.

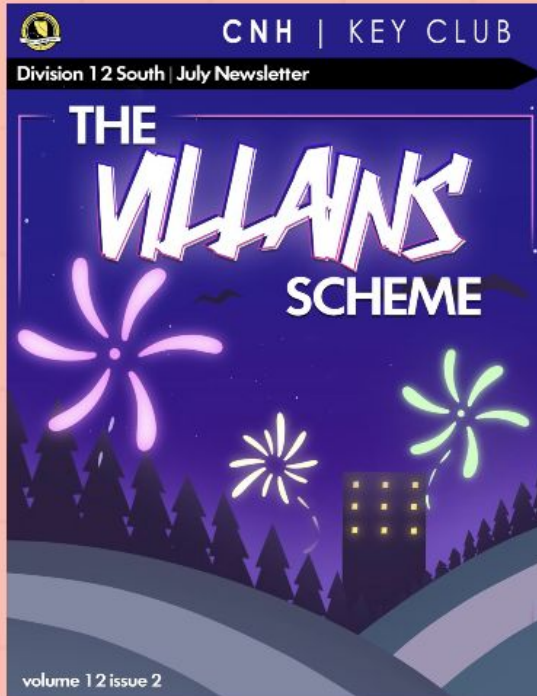
DOG TOY MAKING
