



1. Gather Your Ingredients

- Research your topic + outline key points tailored to your audience

2. Blend Your Ideas

- Use transitions, add personal stories, and use simple, relatable language

3. Whip Your Delivery

- Practice your speech in front of a mirror or record yourself; focus on tone + pace

4. Add Your Toppings

- incorporate gestures + expressions, prepare for potential questions

5. Serve With Style

- Practice delivering in front of a small audience, take feedback constructively, don't forget to smile!

- Pay attention to body language and make eye contact
- If you don't know, don't lie. Promise to get back to them when you do

email

- Best for formal communication
- Utilize the draft function to send at a reasonable time
- Use a clear subject line: make it specific, so the recipient knows what it's about

- Can be used for fast replies
- Make sure to keep important messages to emails rather than texts
- Avoid abbreviations or casual language in formal contexts

division judging committee

- The **Division Judging Committee** judges all Division-judged contests. Committee members must be current Key Club members in **good standing**
- Division Judging Committees are comprised of **general members** and **officers** from clubs across the entire division
- **Division-judged contests:** Member of the Year, Faculty Advisor of the Year, Kiwanis Advisor of the Year, Most Improved Club, Club Attire
- Offers resources to help clubs complete their AAR accurately
- Judging may take place **in-person or online** in January
- Apply to **gain experience** on the division level, further your knowledge of contests, and fulfill the Division Committee Member MRP requirement!
- Contact your **Lieutenant Governor** for the application form and deadline

district judging committee

- The **District Judging Committee** assists the Member Recognition Committee in judging all **District-judged contests**. Committee members must be current Key Club members in **good standing**, have general knowledge about the levels of Key Club, and have the **ability to work with a team** and **strict deadlines**
- Judges can participate in two types of judging: **District Judging** or **On-Site Judging**
- District Judging occurs via the **Internet** and **asynchronously**
- **On-Site Judging** occurs in-person at **District Convention 2025**. On-Site judges must **attend DCON** and may **not** be candidates for higher office or in any other position which will conflict during the times of contest judging (ex: Creative Media Team)
- The Member Recognition Committee is looking for **at least 2 judges** per division
- Apply to **gain leadership experience** at the district level and fulfill the District Committee Member MRP requirement!




